Navigating the Mandatory Care Minutes: Understanding the Changes to Aged Care Classification

As part of the ongoing efforts to enhance the quality of aged care services, the Australian Government is adjusting the allocation of care minutes associated with each Australian National Aged Care Classification (AN-ACC) class.

From 1 October 2023, Registered Nurses (RNs), Enrolled Nurses (ENs) and Personal Care Workers (PCWs) or Assistants in Nursing (AINs, also known as nursing assistants) will be required to deliver an average of 200 minutes per resident per day, including 40 registered nurse minutes.
